#### **CITY UPDATE ON COVID-19**

"Subways and buses are set to return to full service when New York City begins reopening Monday, June 8th. Mayor Bill DeBlasio recommends the following to keep New Yorkers safe on mass transit:

- Increase Frequency of Service: significantly during peak hours while limiting the increase in ridership to allow for maximum social distancing. Return to regular rush hour service for Phase 1. The MTA should prepare to accommodate at least another 100,000 200,000 more riders per day.
- Capacity Limits on Buses/Trains: to allow for social distancing. Skip stops if over capacity.
- Limit Station/Train Overcrowding: Monitor platform crowding and temporarily close stations when needed during peak hours.
- Social Distancing Signage/Markers: Clearly mark six feet of distance on platforms, trains and buses. Demarcate specific seats on trains and buses for

riders, block off every other seat to maintain social distance..."

## Complex Disaster Planning: Preparing for Hurricane Season During the COVID-19 Pandemic



"The Atlantic hurricane season started on June 1, and it is predicted to be more active than normal, with the US National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration forecasting three to six major hurricanes. With indications that the COVID-19 outbreak will continue into the hurricane season, this situation requires a

new kind of planning from businesses, community leaders, emergency managers and the public. Planning needs to happen now.

Emergency managers — including federal officials, private sector authorities, and nonprofits — need to analyze their strategies to develop hurricane-plus-COVID-19 scenarios.

Complex disasters are relatively acute situations affecting large civilian populations, usually involving multiple disasters.

Without proper planning, the threat of hurricanes combined with COVID-19 could have unpleasant consequences. During evacuation, hurricanes force people to gather close together in shelters or treatment locations — at much higher numbers and densities than the CDC recommends for countering a COVID-19 outbreak. Therefore, vulnerable populations such as residents of senior care facilities and individuals with disabilities are particularly affected by both hurricanes and infectious diseases.

Having an established crisis disaster response program in place is the first step in unwinding the complications. Organizations with plans in place may already be updating them in the wake of COVID-19 to include pandemic response protocols, but if not, it is time to re-evaluate them..."
